LAVERNE'S LIFE IN WORDS

LaVerne M. Sandrock, 87, of Philomath passed away Tuesday.

She was born in Milwaukee, Wisconsin to Otto A. and Adele B. (Mundt) Zastrow. She attended South Division High School. She was in the Class of 1948. She received a Bachelor's degree from Dr. Martin Luther College in New Ulm, Minnesota. She married George Sandrock on August 30, 1958 at Atonement Lutheran Church in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. LaVerne taught fifth and sixth grades at Atonement Lutheran School in Milwaukee, Wisconsin from 1951 to 1975. She was a member of Peace Lutheran in Philomath and helped maintain Mt. Union Cemetery for many years. LaVerne enjoyed playing and watching tennis, knitting, Sudoku, tutoring, bowling and gardening. She loved baking goodies and pies.

LaVerne was preceded in death by her husband George Sandrock in 1981; and brother Marvin Zastrow in 2015.
