A Word from Our Pastor:

Proverbs 15:30: A cheerful look brings joy to the heart, and good news gives health to the bones.

The value of a smile! Have you ever thought about it?

I have always come back from mission trips to Guatemala with a great appreciation for the people. If you had to give just one word to describe their demeanor it would be "happy". They live so simply, yet are wanting to give all they have to make visitors feel appreciated. The children are especially friendly climbing all over you as if they were balancing on a jungle gym. I can remember the little ones feeling my hairy arms and being fascinated as they had never seen such a thing. The people, in general, were some of the warmest that I have ever met.

I greatly looked forward to picking up the pictures from my trips to Guatemala. But the pictures never turned out quite like I expected. It wasn't until my most recent trip that it really struck me. Expecting to see smiling faces from the people who were so warm to me, I instead saw sadness. Each picture showed serious faces with very little expression. I was always disappointed with my pictures because they failed to capture the smiles, joys, and all around friendliness that was so clearly shown.

Why? How Strange!?

It wasn't until Alicia pointed something out to me that I finally figured it out. The Guatemalans were expressionless in photos because they did not want others to see their teeth. Their teeth were a sign of great shame and a permanent mark of embarrassment.

Our Guatemala experience has made me think about these words from Proverbs 15:30, "A cheerful look brings joy to the heart." In other words, how important it is to have a smile!

I share this because there are many people in Philomath with the same challenges as the people in Guatemala. Lacking dental coverage, their teeth have not been cleaned. Bypassing significant pain, many have let the tooth pain go in hopes that it would magically go away. Many do doubt if they will ever have a cheerful look again.



Peace will be doing its part to help those having these significant dental needs. In partnership with Love Inc and Medical Teams International, Peace

will be hosting a dental clinic for disadvantaged people in Benton County. The clinic will be held on Thursday, October 2nd from 8 am to 1 pm in our fellowship hall and parking lot.

As host, Peace is providing volunteers, a lunch for all volunteers, and an overall welcoming atmosphere to help the patients feel more at ease as they wait for their appointments.
