WELCOME TO THE HOUSE OF THE LORD

We welcome you in the name of the Lord Jesus. We are honored with your presence. If you do not have a church home, you are invited to join us regularly. Please introduce yourself to Pastor Jeremy Lucke as you leave today and sign the guest book in the entryway. You may also wish to complete one of the pew cards and drop it in the offering plate. Beverages, snacks and fellowship time follow the service in the Fellowship Hall. Everyone is welcome.

The ringing of the bell and the lighting of the Christ candle mark the beginning of our service, and, a time for quiet meditation, prayer and inward reflection as we begin our worship.

Children are welcome at our worship services. However, if you prefer, Peace Lutheran has a nursery equipped for children 3 years old and younger (near the piano, accessible from the hallway). It is not staffed during this service, but has a speaker that will allow you to listen to the service. You are also welcome to use the fellowship room and hallway to walk a noisy child. It also has speakers. Please speak to an usher if you need assistance.

Holy Communion is celebrated today and will follow the order of service in the bulletin. Guests, if you are a baptized Christian and share our faith in Jesus as Savior and have been instructed in the meaning and use of the Lord's Supper, you are invited to come to the altar. If you prefer grape juice to wine, take a cup from the center of the communion tray. We also have gluten free wafers available. If you desire a gluten free wafer, ask the server. May the body and blood of Jesus, present in the bread and wine, be a blessing to you.

There are times during the service that you will be asked to stand if you are able. Please feel free to remain seated if standing is difficult.

As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord. Joshua 24:15b

As You Read Chapter 5 for Next Week.....

- 1. Moses said, "Do not be afraid. God has come to test you, so that the fear of God will be with you to keep you from sinning." (pg. 61) Describe what it means to "fear God" from what you read. Is this the same or different than what you expected? What God might be telling you through this message?
- 2. Moses was an intermediary between the people and God. Has there been someone in your life that prayed for you, helped you see God's will, or acted as a spiritual mentor? Would that type of a relationship be a blessing to you today? How could you do this for someone else?
- 3. God continued to use Aaron even after the golden calf debacle. Have you ever felt that your sin disqualified you for service to God? How does Aaron's story encourage you?
- 4. Moses prayed to God on Israel's behalf (pg. 65-66). Who in your life needs you to intercede for them? Make a list in your journal, and offer a prayer for them now.
- 5. God reminded Moses that children live with the consequences of their parent's sin (pg. 68). Identify a sin or an unhealthy tendency in your own family line that still affects you. What measures can you employ to stop the cycle? What ways have you seen God at work at redeeming those unhealthy cycles?
- 6. Moses' face was radiant because he had spoken with the Lord (pg. 69). When have you experienced God's presence or heard his voice most clearly? What was your experience like?
