A Word from Our Pastor:

Dear Peace Family,

Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. Luke 2:19

Dear Peace family,

My favorite words of the Christmas story are these words that describe Mary's response when she first heard about God's plans. I imagine Mary was so captivated by the angel's words that she chose to look at the world in a whole new way. This would be the defining moment in Mary's life.

I would like for you to think about a few questions. Are Christmas and the Christmas story a defining moment for your life, like it was for Mary? Does Jesus' birth change how you see others? Is Christmas just one part of the year like all the others? Has Christmas become ordinary and routine?

I am sure that you have noticed the subtle and not so subtle changes that have happened during your life. Unfortunately, Christmas has become something that it was never meant to be. Shopping begins with a flurry on Black Friday. I stand correct—shopping begins on Thanksgiving Day night. The story of Christmas has much to do with elves,

boxes, flying reindeer and cookies than it does with wise men, shepherds, and Jesus' birth. It is unsettling to think about some of these changes.

I am proposing that we re-imagine Christmas. Advent is that special time in the church year that is set aside to do just that. My hope is that by the time Christmas comes, these words would be said about us: They treasured all these things and pondered them in their heart. Call it a conspiracy—the Advent Conspiracy. Each week leading up to Christmas we will be reimagining Christmas in new ways.

Week 1 November 29th Worship Fully

The Christmas story starts and ends with Jesus. This should be a season where we are called to put down our burdens and lift up a song to our God. This is a season where love wins, peace reigns and king is born. We enter the season with passion as we seek to worship Jesus to the fullest.

Week 2 December 6th Spend Less

Quick question: What was the one gift you remember getting for Christmas last year? Next question: What about the fourth gift? Do you remember that one? Spending less is not a call to stop giving gifts; it is a call to stop spending money on gifts we will not remember in less than a year.

By spending wisely we free ourselves from worry so that we can take the season in with a full heart.

Week 3 December 13th Children and Youth Christmas program and Give More

What gives......you just said spend less, and now you're saying give more? The most powerful, memorable gift you can give someone else is yourself. Nobody modelled this better than Jesus. When it comes to spending time with those you love, it is about quality, not quantity.

Week 4 December 20th Love All

Love from a Savior empowers us to love all. It is not enough to say "no" to the way Christmas is celebrated by so many, we need to say "yes" to a new way. We celebrate by giving to those who really need our help.



May Jesus' birth bring you strength and joy this year. I look forward to walking with you through this Advent journey.

Read the chapter "A Few Good Men....and Women" of <u>The Story</u> (pages 103-119). Question for consideration: Do you think the Israelites did a good job of passing on their faith to the next generation? How can we do this better in the church and in our own families?

November 8:

Ruth 1:6-18 John 9:1-3

Read the chapter "The Faith of a Foreign Woman" of The Story (pages 121-127). Question for consideration: Meanings of Biblical names are always significant. Elimilek's name meant "God is my king". Naomi's name meant "my pleasantness", but later asked to be called Mara, meaning "bitterness". Ruth's name meant "friendship". Boaz's name meant "swift strength". Who best lived up to their names and who did not?

November 15:

I Samuel 12:20-25 Matthew 22:41-46

Read the chapter "Standing Tall Falling Hard" of <u>The Story</u> (pages 129-143). Question for consideration: The Israelites and Philistines both treated the Ark of the Covenant more like a good luck charm than the sacred presence of the Lord. How might people today try to manipulate God for similar gain?

November 22:

1 Samuel 17:41-50 John 14:9-14

Read the chapter "From Shepherd to King" of <u>The Story</u>. Question for consideration: In his battle with Goliath, "David ran quickly toward the battle line to meet him". When have you had the courage to face down and impending conflict?

Here are some specifics:


- ◆ We will be taking credit cards this year.
