While many congregations use this service to remember those saints who have departed this life in faith, we do well remember that "saint" is simply another word for "believer" or "follower of Jesus." All of those who gather to confess Jesus as Lord are indeed already saints. The Gospel for today is a section of the Sermon on the Mount known as the Beatitudes. They are part of the reign and rule of God. All saints, including you, are a part of the reign and rule of God; therefore, you are blessed!

- 10 and crying out with a loud voice, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!"
- ¹¹ And all the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God,
- ¹² saying, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen."
