LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

Pastor: On the four Sundays in Advent, we light a new candle each week. We mark the four candles with these four words: hope, peace, joy, and love. Jesus Christ is the hope of all nations.

People: We wait for the Lord, and in His Word do we hope.

The third candle is lit during the Advent Song.

ADVENT SONG "My Soul in Stillness Waits"

People: For you, O Lord, my soul in stillness waits; truly my hope is in you.

Pastor: O Root of Life, im-plant your seed with-in us, and in your ad-vent, draw us all to you, our hope re-born in dy-ing and in ris-ing.

People: For you, O Lord, my soul in stillness waits; truly my hope is in you.

WE CONFESS OUR SIN ...

Pastor: We don't always rejoice in the Lord as Psalm 146 asks us to do. During our time of confession, we admit our sins to God and one another. We also count on God to restore joy to our lives through the forgiveness He offers in Jesus.

Silence for reflection

Pastor: We confess to You, O Lord, that we are captive to sin in thought, word, and deed. We have wandered from you. Our wonderings have at times turned into doubts that drew us away from You.

People: Remember Your mercy, O Lord, and Your steadfast love, for they have been from of old.

Pastor: Remember not the sins of my youth or my transgressions;

People: according to Your steadfast love remember me, for the sake of Your goodness, O Lord!

... HEARING GOD'S FORGIVENESS

Pastor: Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Luke 7:18-28

- ²⁰ And when the men had come to him, they said, "John the Baptist has sent us to you, saying, 'Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?'"
- ²¹ In that hour he healed many people of diseases and plagues and evil spirits, and on many who were blind he bestowed sight.
- ²² And he answered them, "Go and tell John what you have seen and heard: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, the poor have good news preached to them.
- ²³ And blessed is the one who is not offended by me." ²⁴ When John's messengers had gone, Jesus began to speak to the crowds concerning John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed shaken by the wind?
- ²⁵ What then did you go out to see? A man dressed in soft clothing? Behold, those who are dressed in splendid clothing and live in luxury are in kings' courts. ²⁶ What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet.
