You can prepare for each of these messages by reading the Scripture passage ahead of time and thinking about your own family circumstances. Here is the plan:





Ok last month when I left you, it was as an infant. We talked about the physical needs and I think we all know about that. Even at that young age, we already needed to be with others socially. We found great joy when the people around us spent time with us, more than just feeding us and taking care of our needs. I heard this woman talking about going in an orphanage in another country and she said she went in a room with a lot of babies and they were really quiet. She said they didn't even cry. When she asked about it she was told that they don't cry because they know that no one would come to them, so they had given up. I don't know about you, but I find that incredibly sad. To think that an infant, would have to live in a world where no one comes to comfort you or sit with you and make you laugh. That hard-wired

need to connect socially and emotionally was not being met. I wonder what a child such as that would grow up to think of the world if they never had the chance to be attached to others. Studies have shown that children who come from neglect often have attachment disorders. The hard-wired process of connecting with others has gone horribly wrong. Even as little children, God wants to connect with us in a spiritual way as well. I have known some young people who have disabilities and are very child-like even as they grow up. When they are exposed to the Lord, their faith is simple and beautiful. They truly understand God's love. Matthew 19:14 – but Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven."

Lord, let us come to you and connect to you as a little child, as Your child.

## Recognizing a Stroke

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify, but the faster a victim can get medical attention the easier it is to minimize the negative effects. Recently Joan McDonald submitted an article spelling out Four Easy ways for family, friends and bystanders to identify a person who may have had a stroke. These signs of a stroke can be remembered with the mnemonic **F.A.S.T.** 

- ➤ **F** Face: Ask the person to smile, is the smile "normal" or is it lopsided. Does one side of the person's face look droopy
- ➤ A Arms: Ask the person to raise their arms up. Can they get both arms up over their head?
  Does only one arm respond.
- ➤ **S** Speech: Can the person repeat simple phrases (i.e. Chicken Soup) or answer a simple question. Can they form words?
- > T Time: If ANY of the above signs are abnormal for that person get them to the hospital
