PRELUDE

OPENING UP TO GOD

- P: If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. Let us now take some time to be honest to God and one another about ourselves by confessing our sins.
- C: Lord, as we gather this morning in celebration, we must admit that the songs that we sing have lacked joy. Too concerned with the challenges of life, our past failures and the darkness of the world around us, we have failed even to lift up our voice. We pray for your forgiveness. Rekindle in our hearts the joy in knowing that You are for us and that You stand by our side forever!

"Light One Candle"

(Silence for reflection)

P: To us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. Jesus is the one who was promised many years ago. Because of His life and death, God forgives you all your sins. I declare this forgiveness in God's name—in the name and by the authority granted by God—the Father, Son and Holy Spirit—I forgive you all of your sins! Sing a new song!

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON:

<u>2 Samuel 7:1-11, 16</u>

"Your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever."

Now when the king lived in his house and the Lord had given him rest from all his surrounding enemies, the king said to Nathan the prophet, "See now, I dwell in a house of cedar, but the ark of God dwells in a tent." And Nathan said to the king, "Go, do all that is in your heart, for the Lord is with you."

But that same night the word of the Lord came to Nathan, "Go and tell my servant David, 'Thus says the Lord: Would you build me a house to dwell in? I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent for my dwelling. In all places where I have moved with all the people of Israel, did I speak a word with any of the judges of Israel, whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, saying, "Why have you not built me a house of cedar?" Now, therefore, thus you shall say to my servant David, 'Thus says the Lord of hosts, I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep, that you should be prince over my people Israel. And I have been with you wherever you went and have cut off all your enemies from before you. And I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth. And violent men shall afflict them no more, as formerly, from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel. And I will give you rest from all your enemies. Moreover, the Lord declares to you that the Lord will make you a house.

GOSPEL LESSON

Luke 1:26-<u>38</u>

"The angel appears to Mary."

But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And the Lord God will give to Him the throne of His father David, and He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of His kingdom there will be no end."
