The room is unstaffed and can be accessed via the hallway from the narthex. There is a speaker that will allow you to listen to the service. You are also welcomed to use the Fellowship Hall and hallway to walk a noisy child; it also has speakers. Please speak to an usher if you need assistance.

Letter from President Linnemann about Concordia University

Dear Partners in Ministry,

This morning it was announced that Concordia University Portland would be closing at the end of the current semester. I am writing to share with you that this is indeed the case and to ask for your prayers for a community that is deeply grieving.

I was present for the announcements – first to the faculty and staff, and then to the students. There were many expressions of sadness and grief as the news started to sink in. As an alumnus of both the high school and the college, my heart is heavy, too. I will be forever grateful for the learning, friendships, and spiritual growth that were given to me on Concordia's campus – not to mention the blessing of a wonderful spouse in my wife, Cindy. Many of you who are receiving this letter can relate to the gift that Concordia has been and continues to be in our lives. We will continue to praise God for all these profound and lasting blessings.

What causes me the most grief from this news are the missed opportunities for reflecting the love of Jesus to people. Concordia had undergone a transformation. It was a place where Christian leaders were trained and grew spiritually so that they could be in mission once they graduated. It since moved to a place where it became the mission field, as many students came to Concordia as a place where they encountered the Gospel and the love of Christ for the first time. That's the part that hurts my heart the most.

I also want to express my thanks to the Concordia leaders who handled the challenge of sharing the news today with care, compassion, and skill. I am thankful for Rev. Dr. Tom Ries, interim president, who stepped into a difficult situation and has shared the realities with clarity and compassion.

I am asking for your prayer support in the days ahead. Please pray for students who have choices to make about their future. Pray for faculty and staff who will be seeking new positions. Pray for administrators who will be seeking ways to help all of the above. Pray for the mission of God in the Northwest, that we might identify ways to fill this big hole. For all involved, pray for the peace of God that passes understanding (Philippians 4:7) – the peace that makes no logical sense – that even in the middle of these difficult circumstances, they might see God's blessing and be embraced by His unfailing love.
