CONFESSING TO GOD

P: Our passage from Philippians encourages us to "count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Jesus." The Apostle Paul could say these words. He was one who experienced great loss throughout his life—even losing his freedom as he was held in jail. Paul counted his relationship with Jesus as the most important part of his life. This gave him hope and purpose. As we open our worship, we begin by reflecting upon the many times that we have not followed Paul's example—forgetting the worth that comes from knowing Jesus.

Silent Reflection

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C: Lord, you have called us to follow you. Instead of following you, we have gone different ways. We have valued our connection to earthly things rather than our relationship with you. We haven't counted everything else as loss, but have desired more and more of what we have. Give us a new heart today in your forgiveness. We want to value you above all else.

P: Paul once said, "One thing I do....... I forget what lies behind and strain forward to what lies ahead." These words of advice are made possible in a real way through God's forgiveness. What lies behind us is our sin—Jesus takes it on himself. What lies ahead is a new life partnering with God in His mission. Because of Jesus' sacrificial love, I declare to you that all of your sins are forgiven. I do so in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

HEARING FROM GOD'S WORD

Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 43:16-21

God is able to make all things new

This is what the LORD says— he who made a way through the sea, a path through the mighty waters, who drew out the chariots and horses, the army and reinforcements together, and they lay there, never to rise again, extinguished, snuffed out like a wick: "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland. The wild animals honor me, the jackals and the owls, because I provide water in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland, to give drink to my people, my chosen, the people I formed for myself that they may proclaim my praise."

New Testament Reading: Philippians 3:8-14

Paul's encouragement to live with purpose and direction

Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith—that I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind an straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

Gospel Reading: Luke 20:9-20

The parable of the workers in the vineyard

Jesus began to tell the people this parable: "A man planted a vineyard and let it out to tenants and went into another country for a long while. When the time came, he sent a servant to the tenants, so that they would give him some of the fruit of the vineyard. But the tenants beat him and sent him away empty-handed. And he sent another servant. But they also beat and treated him shamefully, and sent him away empty-handed. And he sent yet a third. This one also they wounded and cast out. Then the owner of the vineyard said, 'What shall I do? I will send my beloved son; perhaps they will respect him.' But when the tenants saw him, they said to themselves, 'This is the heir. Let us kill him, so that the inheritance may be ours.' And they threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. What then will the owner of the vineyard do to them? He will come and destroy those tenants and give the vineyard to others." When they heard this, they said, "Surely not!" But he looked directly at them and said, "What then is this that is written:

"The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone'?

"Everyone who falls on that stone will be broken to pieces, and when it falls on anyone, it will crush him."

The scribes and the chief priests sought to lay hands on him at that very hour, for they perceived that he had told this parable against them, but they feared the people. So they watched him and sent spies, who pretended to be sincere, that they might catch him in something he said, so as to deliver him to the authority and jurisdiction of the governor.
